God belongs in everything we do, including our workplaces! As we worship God, work with integrity, love our neighbors, and cherish our families, we become billboards of God's message.




Say a Prayer

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." - Philippians 4:6-7 (English Standard Version)

A simple prayer before a meeting can inspire permission for others to do the same. Allow participation to be voluntary, but demonstrate your faith by saying a short prayer to start a leadership meeting. It doesn't have to be long or profound, just from the heart.

Things you could pray for at work:

- Safety for your team
- Specific needs of co-workers
- Success and influence of the company in your community or industry
- That God would be glorified through your work
- Life change for employees who seem interested in exploring their faith

Bring in Chaplaincy



A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." - John 13:34-35



Setting up regular Chaplaincy is an effective way to care for your associates. The confidentiality of Chaplaincy allows associates to share openly and get the help they need. Chaplains often steer people to the resources they need for complete healing to take place and offer accountability going forward. Chaplaincy is an effective way to minister to your teams.

What are some ways you can bring chaplaincy into your organization?

- **Contract** Many options exist to provide professional chaplaincy support to your business. These include national chaplaincy organizations, Marketplace Chaplains, and Corporate Chaplains of America
- **Local Pastor or Minister** If you have a relationship with a local pastor or minister, bringing them into your organization can be a great way to build a strong bridge between your employees and the surrounding community.
- **Full-time Chaplaincy** Some organizations have created a full-time chaplaincy position which can be an excellent solution for businesses with a large number of employees.

Set up a Care Committee

Some steps you can take to set up a Care Committee:

- Set aside a portion of profits into a 501(c)3
- Appoint a committe chair
- Invite team members to join the committee
- Survey your company to learn about opportunities to serve others inside and outside your organization

Prayer Requests




Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. - James 5:16

Some companies have a specific place for associates to share prayer requests. This allows associates to share in each others concerns and celebrations as they deepen their relationships on a personal level.

Some creative ways to share prayer requests:

- Put up a bulletin board with index cards people can write prayer requests on.
- Create a channel on a company-wide instant messaging system for employees to share prayer needs and let other know they are being prayed for.
- Create a box where people can anonymously drop prayer requests on a slip of paper.
- Before prayer always ask if anyone has any specific requests.

Bible Study

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work.

- 2 Timothy 3:16-17

Encourage an associate to lead a Bible study during work hours. Many companies provide refreshments as associates take some time to deepen their faith through study of the Bible or Christian literature.

Some tips for starting a Bible Study at work:

- Let it happen naturally. Use a lunch our when people typically gather and start with a simple devotional.
- Someone has to go first. Sometimes it just takes someone being bold and offering to lead.
- Keep it simple. Study one chapter from the Bible each meeting and have a few discussion questions ready, leaving time for fellowship and prayer.
- Don't get stuck in a numbers game. Even if only one or two people show up each time, God will still be glorified.

Build a Chapel

But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. - Matthew 6:6

Provide a space for prayer and reflection. Some companies set aside specific space for a chapel so associates have a quiet place to go for prayer and reflection.

Some ideas for setting up a chapel:

- Use an extra office or seldom-used space
- Have speakers playing quiet music to drown out sounds from outside the space
- Put in some comfortable seating or even floor cushions/ pillows
- Offer a focal point like a cross, candles, Scripture on the walls, peaceful imagery, etc.





Courtyard & Fountains



So Solomon built the house and finished it. He lined the walls of the house on the inside with boards of cedar. From the floor of the house to the walls of the ceiling, he covered them on the inside with wood, and he covered the floor of the house with boards of cypress. - 1 Kings 6:14-15



Creating a beautiful space matters to God. It can go a long way to provide a space for people to connect with each other and build relationships. Intentional investment in an environment for relationships, offers an opportunity for deeper connections between team members.

If your organization doesn't have the land to add a courtyard or fountain, consider other alternatives such as some simple outdoor seating or reserving a room with lots of natural light. Being able to be in, or observe nature, can result in increased productivity and improved mental health.

Mission Trips

Some companies arrange mission trips for their associates. Serving together on a mission trip is an opportunity to provide team building and connection that can't be matched in a conference room.

How to find mission trip opportunities:

- Connect with the missions/outreach pastor of a local church
- Search for mission organizations doing work that aligns with your company's skillsets
- Partner with a missions organization that offers annual trips your organization can have an ongoing relationship with
- Offer employees a PTO week for a mission trip





ISO Certifcation



Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth. - 2 Timothy 2:15



The International Organization for Standardization (ISO) is a third party body that offers a seal of approval to comapanies that run one of their international standards. Setting up ISO Certification in Care and Compassion demonstrates a commitment to having a stable and well-run organizational structure. Some businesses take care and compassion as seriously as they do safety and profits!

How do you obtain ISO certification?

From <u>OSL</u>: "Our simple six step process makes getting certified easy! We undertake an initial assessment of the company, to see where the company currently stands with regards to the chosen ISO certification. From this we make a series of recommendations on what needs to be done to become compliant (we will not make any major procedure changes unless absolutely necessary).

We will then draw up a plan for implementing the recommendations (to be completed over the next 6-12 months), complete as many of them for you as possible, write your manual and mandatory standard operating procedures (as required by the standard) and then 6-8 weeks after the first initial assessment visit come back to present the manual with your ISO certification."
